A **Teaching Outline** is an outline of the topics and subtopics covered in a specific lesson.

A **Pocket Principle®** is a brief essay, based on a Teaching Outline, that focuses on a single lesson necessary to the growth and maturity of a believer.

A **Guided Discussion** is a group of questions based on the content in the Pocket Principle® ideally discussed during an interactive time within the context of a small group. The major goal of the Guided Discussion is to encourage application of the content.

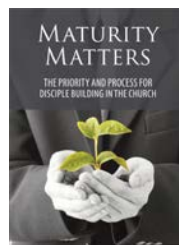

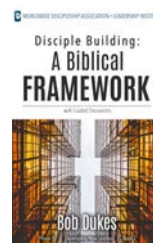

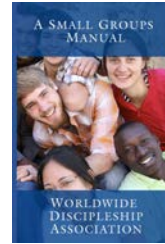

The Leadership Institute curriculum builds mature and effective believers, equipping them to minister to others and eventually to lead healthy, Christ-centered ministries.

Participants are strongly encouraged to complete Phase I - II prior to beginning the Leadership Institute. Churches are encouraged to take care in who they invite to participate in the Leadership Institute, as some believers may not be ready to minister to, or lead others.

"Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of Him who is the head, that is, Christ. From Him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work." Ephesians 4:15-16 (NIV)

Phase III: Equipping For Ministry

After a disciple has matured and developed a strong personal relationship with God, Phase III materials equip the disciple to minister outwardly to others. The disciple will learn how to share their testimony and the gospel as well as how to deal with the questions non-Christians often ask. This new venture into ministry will cause the disciple to consider issues such as time management, ministry priorities and spiritual warfare. The disciple will learn more about the important doctrines that grow from a position in Christ and come to understand more about healthy relationships. The material in Phase III has been designed to help a church (or other ministry) develop a progressive disciple building strategy for the ministry trainee.

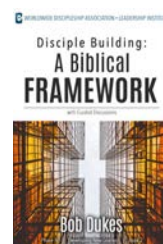

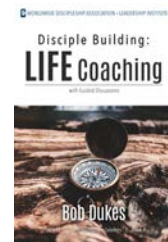

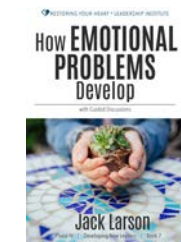

Emotional and relational healing is a critical part of the discipleship process, but is often overlooked.

The Restoring Your Heart® curriculum is designed for use in a safe, small group experience that helps people discover the past hurts affecting their present, guides them through a responsible grieving process, and leads them to a place of full forgiveness.

"The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners." Isaiah 61:1 (NIV)

As a disciple is growing in their relationship with the Lord, they may experience road blocks in their capacity to hear from God, minister to others, or lead healthily and effectively. This is commonly connected to unprocessed emotional and relational pain or hurts. Restoring Your Heart® materials and group experiences equip the disciple with tools to process old and new pain, gain a more robust emotional vocabulary, triumph over shame, and increase freedom and growth in Christ.

RYH is for everybody, not just those who have experienced addiction or a great trauma. This process helps the disciple identify and obtain freedom from pain they did not even know was there.

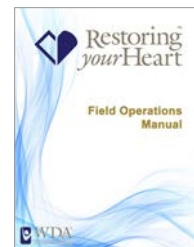
